## Local Updates.

The local NPT have made significant progress into the recent spate of ASB in Sutton on Sea. A further number of persons have been spoken to in relation to ASB and as a result of this they have been dealt with accordingly.

Over the past 7 weeks a Fair Play Football league has been running in Louth for young people. We have had teams representing both Alford and Mablethorpe. The aim of the tournament is not give points for winning games but give points for how the young persons conducted themselves on and around the football pitches. I am pleased to inform you that one of our teams finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in the league and a number of young persons from our area finished within the top 20 players. Well done to all who participated.

A challenge was made to the police by a group of young persons from the ACCESS centre in Alford. Having just received a new Table Tennis table as part of a police-funding bid, the young persons challenged PC Jones, PCSO Burchnell and PCSO Phillips to games of table tennis. The winners on the night were the young people, beating the police 10-4. It was a great night, which was enjoyed by all.

A successful Benefits day was held in Alford recently. This was organised by PCSO Phillips and Debbie Prince from the NMT. It brought together a number of agencies that were on hand to offer help and advice to persons. The day was a great success and is going to be repeated in Mablethorpe on the 8<sup>th</sup> June at the library on Stanley Avenue.
